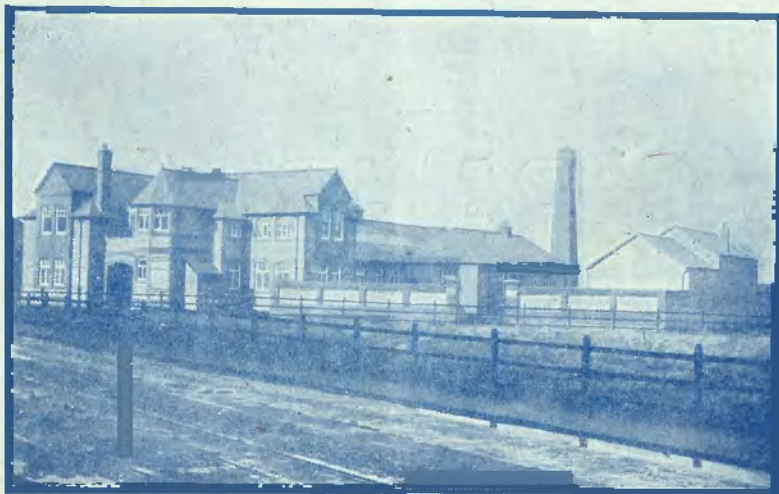

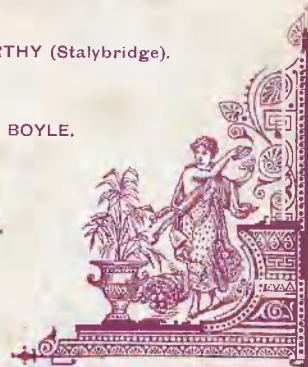

ST. VINCENT'S, ALTRINCHAM



THE Mission of St. Vincent's was first established in 1847, in a small house in George Street. The first resident Priest was Father M. O'Reilly, 1847-53, who was followed by Father Berry from 1853-55. In 1855 came Father Walton, who rented a cottage in New Street, still standing. A pen-and-ink sketch of the interior of this primitive chapel is still preserved. In 1858 Father Alcock succeeded Father Walton who had already acquired possession of two cottages higher up in New Street. One of these Father Alcock himself occupied, the other was set apart, with many alterations, for the purpose of a School and teacher's residence. In the gardens behind the cottages he built, in 1860, the present Chapel, then regarded as a Cathedral. The School premises were enlarged and used until 1872, when the new Schools on the Moss were built.

During the years of his ministry, 1858-1876, Father Alcock had the assistance of Fathers Casey and Crawley. With their help he founded the Mission of Knutsford, of which place Father Casey became in 1867 the first Rector. Sale Moor now occupied the attention of Father Alcock, and a Mission was established here, of which Father (now Canon) Crawley became the first Rector in 1870. Latchford also was established by the unwearrying efforts of Father Alcock, and Father Mulvaney took charge of this place in 1870.

Thus Altrincham became a centre of Catholicity, and the parent of several missions in this portion of Cheshire.

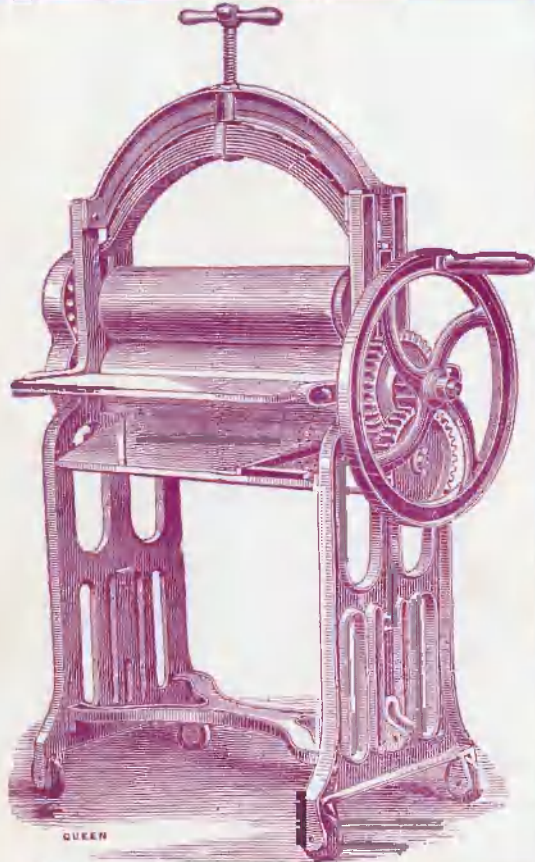
On the retirement of Father Alcock in 1876, Father O'Brien succeeded. The two cottages in New Street were now joined together to form the Presbytery. The lower portion of the old Schools, now no longer needed, was added to the Chapel, and the upper storey was converted into a club-room.

The new Schools had been opened on the 2nd of February, 1872. In 1885 the Infant School was added, and in 1895 they were further enlarged by the addition of a new class-room and cloak-room. Now, in 1902, further class and cloak-room accommodation is required by the Board of Education.

Father O'Brien was raised to the dignity of Canon in 1898. His failing health had already called for assistance, and Father Jones came as assistant Priest in 1895, and later in 1898 came Father Clarke.

In October, 1898, Canon O'Brien's health broke down completely. He relinquished his charge of the Parish. and retired to Isleworth where he died January 12th, 1899. Father Stanley succeeded in October, 1898, with Father Clarke to assist, Father Jones moving to Birkenhead. In April, 1899, Father Clarke's health began to fail. He too retired to Isleworth, and died October 7th, 1899. Thus the Parish lost by death two Priests in one year. Father N. Kelly took the place of Father Clarke in May, 1899.

The new Church will stand in Regent Road, on a triangular plot secured from the Stamford Trustees, between Groby and Bentinck Roads. The design is by Mr. E. Kirby, of Liverpool, and the estimated cost £5000.

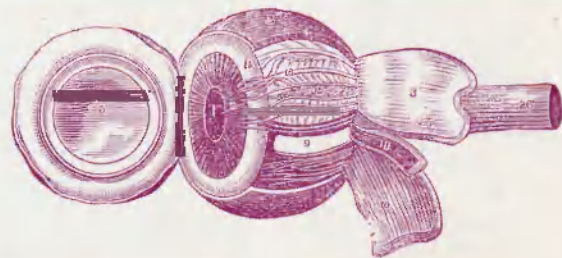

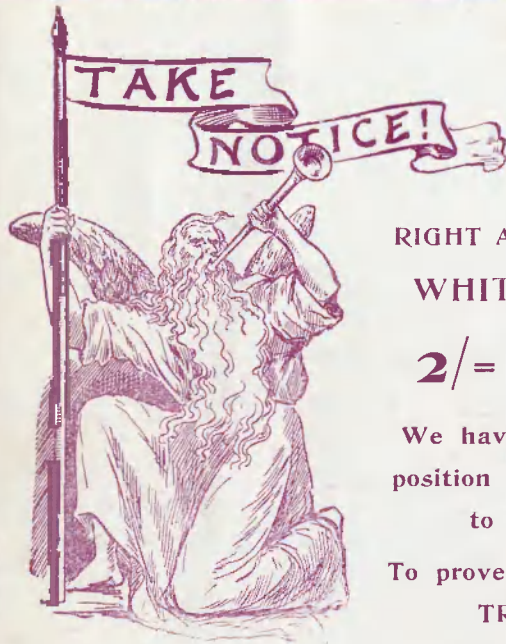
