ALTRINCHAM

ALTRINCHAM (or, as it is frequently written, Altring-
 ham) is a market town and parish, 30 miles north-
 east from Chester, 7 north-east from Knutsford, 9 west
 from Stockport, 8 south-south-west from Manchester, 11
 east from Warrington, 18½ from Bolton, 30 from Liverpool

and 193½ from London, and is within the Altrincham
 division of the county, and in the rural deanery of
 Bowdon, and archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of
 Chester: it is also in the hundred and union of Bucklow,
 the latter having been formed in 1895 in place of the old

Altrincham union. The town is an important railway centre, and has four separate but connected stations:—Altrincham and Bowdon station, in Stamford road, near the centre of the town, belonging to the Manchester, South Junction and Altrincham railway; Hale station, at the southern extremity of the town, on the Cheshire Lines railway; Broadheath station, to the north, on the London and North Western line; and West Timperley station, north of the town, on the Cheshire Lines railway.

The Bridgewater canal, now the property of the Manchester Ship Canal Co. intersects the township for three-quarters of a mile at Broadheath.

Altrincham was constituted a Local Government District 18 Feb. 1851, under the provisions of the "Public Health Act, 1848" (11 & 12 Vict. c. 63), and was under the control of a Local Board, until, under the provisions of the "Local Government Act, 1894" (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73), the present Urban District Council was established. The Urban District is divided into five wards.

Hamon de Massey, lord of Dunham Massey, by charter in the reign of Edward I. (circ. 1290), granted to the town the position of a free borough, instituting burgesses, and a gild merchant, and authorised the burgesses to elect a praepositus or bailiff, now styled "mayor," and this charter "is still preserved, enclosed in a circular oak case or box, shaped like an inverted cone, two or three inches in diameter." The mayor is still appointed annually at the Michaelmas court leet of the lord of the barony, by the steward, but he possesses no magisterial authority, and his duties appear to have been confined to the opening of the fairs, which are now obsolete; there is no corporate seal, chain or badge of any kind. The arms of the town are "quarterly, gu. and or. in the first quarter a lion pass. arg."

The town, which occupies a very healthy situation, comprises several wide streets, and is lighted with gas from works at Moss lane, Hale, about half-a-mile east, erected about 1850, and covering $4\frac{1}{2}$ acres; the works are the property of a company, incorporated in 1872, and the water supply is from Manchester, with two reservoirs at Bowdon, of the North Cheshire Water Company.

St. George's is an ecclesiastical parish, first formed out of the mother parish of Bowdon, Aug. 28, 1860, and made a separate parish in 1868.

The church, in Church street, built by subscription in 1799, and twice enlarged, was rebuilt in 1896 from designs by Messrs. Paley and Austin, architects, at a cost of £5,500, and reopened Nov. 17, 1897: it consists of chancel, nave, aisles and a western tower containing one bell: the stained east window, a memorial to Samuel and Ann Hardy, was presented by their daughter, Sarah Holland, in 1861: the west window is a memorial to William P. Grimble Groves, and was placed in 1897: the fine alabaster pulpit is a memorial to John Newton esq.: the alabaster wainscot of the chancel was given in 1898 by Charles Newton and Henry Fairbrother esqrs.: the alabaster font is a memorial to the Rev. George London, vicar 1860-1894: the stained glass of the seven windows in the north aisle was all removed from the old church and replaced in the original tracery: the brass lectern was given by Henry Fairbrother esq.: the church will seat 700 persons. The register dates from the year 1799. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £350, chiefly derived from pew rents, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Bowdon for the time being, and held since 1914 by the Rev. Ernest Scales Oliver B.A. of Oriel College, Oxford. The vicarage house is near the church.

St. John the Evangelist's is an ecclesiastical parish, formed Nov. 5, 1867, out of Bowdon St. Margaret, Dunham Massey and Timperley. The church, erected in 1866, at a cost of over £8,000, is a building of stone in the Gothic style, consisting of chancel, nave, aisles, transepts, south and west porches and a south-west tower with octagonal spire. The church affords 950 sittings, of which half are free. The register dates from the year 1866. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £450, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Chester, and held since 1866 by the Rev. Frederick Wainwright M.A. of Trinity College, Cambridge, and hon. canon of Chester.

St. Elizabeth's church, in Pownall street, erected in 1890, will seat 300 persons. The Rev. Leonard Thomas William Parr M.A. of Oxford University, has been curate in charge since 1905.

All Saints', Regent road, is a chapel-of-ease to St. Margarets, Dunham Massey, from which it is served, and has sittings for 300 persons.

The Catholic church of St. Vincent de Paul, at the junction of Bentinck and Groby roads, was completed in 1906.

The Baptist chapel, in Hale road, erected in 1887, has 450 sittings; a new lecture hall, class rooms, organ chamber and vestry were added in 1908 at a cost of about £1,400.

Bowdon Downs Congregational chapel was erected in 1839, and has 800 sittings. There is a Congregational chapel in Manchester road, Broadheath, built in 1865, seating 500 persons.

The United Methodist chapel, in George street, was erected in 1820, and there is a Primitive Methodist chapel in Oxford road and Devonshire road; the Unitarian chapel, in Dunham road, erected in 1876, will seat 350 persons.

The Wesleyan Methodist chapel in Woodlands road, built in 1866 at a cost of £7,000, is of stone, in the Romanesque style, and will seat 750 persons, the Wesleyan Methodist chapel, Broadheath, erected in 1899, at a cost of £1,700, has sittings for 350 persons, and there is another Wesleyan chapel in Borough road.

The Welsh Calvinistic Methodist chapel, in Willow Tree road, was built in 1903 at a cost of £924, and will seat 180.

The Salvation Army hall is in George street.

The Altrincham Urban Council Cemetery, Hale road, opened 12th December, 1894, at a cost of about £9,000, covers an area of 10 acres, of which 5 only are at present enclosed. It contains a small chapel, which is used for all denominations and is governed by the Altrincham Urban District Council.

The Town Hall, in Market street, erected in 1901 from the designs of Messrs. Hindle and Davenport, of Manchester, is a structure of red brick and red sandstone dressings in the Jacobean style; it contains a large hall with mosaic floor; the council chamber, 35 ft. by 26 ft. with a panelled ceiling and stained windows, displaying the arms of the Barons of Chester and the principal Cheshire families; the carved oak chairs were specially designed and made by Mr. Joseph Phillips, of Altrincham: here also are the offices of the clerk, surveyor, rate collector and overseers; the staircase windows bear the Royal arms and those of Altrincham, Chester and Manchester. Adjoining is the Fire Station, where is kept a steam fire engine belonging to the Urban District Council; the force comprises 12 men and a superintendent; there is a comfortably fitted-up room for the firemen, and also a mortuary.

The old Town Hall, near the Market place, erected by the Earl of Stamford and Warrington in 1849, is an edifice of red brick with stone dressings, relieved in front by a bell turret with clock; the lower portion is now used as a grain store, above which, and extending along the whole length of the building, is an assembly room 66 feet by 30, now attached to the Unicorn hotel and used for public and masonic meetings, balls and lectures; it will seat about 300 persons.

The Market hall, in Market street, erected in 1879, at a cost of £5,000, from the designs of Mr. M. A. Roscoe, architect, of Altrincham, is of brick in the Italian style, the whole enclosing a space of about 90 feet by 60.

The market for butter, eggs, poultry, rabbits, fruit and drapery is held on Tuesdays, weekly.

Cabinet making is carried on. At Broadheath are coal wharfs on the Bridgewater Canal undertaking; there are also iron foundries, timber yards, saw mills, nurseries and photographic apparatus manufactories. Here are also the works of Linotype and Machinery Limited.

An agricultural and horticultural show is held annually. The public slaughter houses, built in 1870, on the outskirts of the town, have been taken over by the Urban District Council, and new and much improved premises were added in 1904.

The Sessions house and Police station, in Dunham road, is an edifice of brick and stone erected in 1866 and enlarged in 1903. Attached are retiring rooms for the magistrates, police office and lock-ups, with residence for the superintendent on one side, and a parade ground at the back; on the premises is a fire bell; the County court is also held here.

Altrincham Conservative club, in Market street, erected in 1882 at a cost of £2,000, is a structure of white brick in the Italian style and contains billiard, reading, smoking, lecture and committee rooms, a bar, and a manager's residence, and has a bowling green adjoining. It is the Conservative centre for the Altrincham division of the county.

The Altrincham Jubilee Baths, Stamford New road, under the management of the Urban District Council, erected in commemoration of the 60th year of the reign of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, are of brick, having

a swimming bath, 60 feet by 20 feet, and five slipper baths. In 1909 a swimming bath, 75 feet by 30 feet, and eight private baths were added at a cost of £3,500.

The Altrincham Free Library, Public Hall and Museum, in George street, formerly the Altrincham and Bowdon Literary Institution, was taken over by the Local Board (now the Urban District Council), on the adoption by the Board of the Public Libraries and Technical Education Acts, in 1899. The first building was erected in 1852, at a cost of £800, on a site given by George Harry, 7th Earl of Stamford and Warrington. The lecture hall, destroyed by fire in 1878, was rebuilt on an enlarged scale in the following year; and in 1893 the whole was generally enlarged at a cost of £6,000. The library, comprising lending and reference departments, now contains some 12,000 volumes, and has a reading room well supplied with daily, weekly and monthly papers and magazines &c. The hall, which holds 700 persons, is well adapted for stage plays, bazaars, balls, concerts &c. The Museum, opened in 1898, includes a collection of objects presented by the late Sir Cunliffe Brooks, and a fine collection of birds, fossils, minerals and curios.

St. Margaret's Institute, in Market street, in connection with St. Margaret's church, Dunham Massey, was erected in 1896 at a cost of £2,500, from designs by Mr. Gouldsmith, architect, and contains a large room for concerts and dramatic performances, seating about 350 people. There are also reading and billiard rooms and a good gymnasium. Weaving and wood-carving classes are held here. The Institute is open to persons of both sexes, and there are about 800 members.

The Altrincham Conservative Working Men's Club, in Greenwood street, erected in 1887, is a spacious brick building, with manager's quarters attached.

St. John's club rooms, Islington street, in connection with St. John's church, are open every evening.

The General Hospital for accidents and medical and surgical cases, in Market street, built in 1870 from designs by the late Mr. Peter Pons, of Altrincham, is a spacious edifice of brick and stone which has been considerably

improved since its first erection. It was enlarged in 1913 and 1914 by the addition of a new out-patients' department, accident and dressing rooms, dispensary, mortuary and laundry, and now consists of accident ward, men's medical and surgical wards, women's wards, children's wards and four small private wards. It contains 60 beds and cots. The Provident Dispensary for out-door cases is in the new building, and there are also eye and dental departments. A nurses' home for 21 nurses has been erected. There are also trained and certificated nurses available for attendance on private cases. Miss Fulham is lady superintendent.

Stamford Public Park, comprising 16 acres, was formed out of Hale Moss, a piece of land given to the Local Board in 1879 by the 7th Earl of Stamford and Warrington; it has been laid out with walks and flower-beds, cricket, football and lawn tennis grounds and a bowling green, and a bathing pond has also been formed, at a cost of £5,000. This park is now under the control of the Urban District Council.

The neighbourhood contains a great many detached villa residences, principally occupied by Manchester merchants.

The Countess of Stamford is lady of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil of the country around is well adapted for the growth of fruit and vegetables, particularly carrots and onions; the former have acquired a universal celebrity and are known as the Altrincham, or green-top, carrot.

The population of the civil parish and Urban District in 1891 was 12,424, in 1901, 16,831, and in 1911, 17,813; the acreage is 662; rateable value in 1914, £104,638.

The population of the wards in 1911 was—Central, 2,230; East, 4,128; North, 5,161; South, 3,744; West, 2,550.

The population of the ecclesiastical parishes in 1911 was—St. George, 8,230; St. John the Evangelist, 8,646.

ALVANLEY is a parish, township and small village, in a hilly district, 3 miles south-south-west from Frodsham and $1\frac{1}{2}$ south from the Helsby station on the London and North Western and Great Western joint railways, in the Eddisbury division of the county, Runcorn union and county court district, hundred and petty sessional division of Eddisbury, rural deanery of Frodsham and archdeaconry and diocese of Chester. This place has furnished the title of baron to the Arderne or Arden family, barons Alvanley, but it became extinct on the death of the third baron, 24 June, 1857. Alvanley ecclesiastical parish was formed in 1861. The church of St. John the Evangelist, erected in 1861, near the site of an oratory, founded by Catherine Arderne in 1446, during the reign of Henry VI. took the place of a chapelry built in 1540, and pulled down in 1860. It is a building of stone, consisting of chancel, nave of four bays, aisles, south porch and a small western turret containing 2 bells: there are five stained windows—two presented by the Hon. Miss Arden, of Tarporeley, who built the church; one to her memory, erected by the parishioners in 1875; one in memory of the Whitley family, and a baptistery window, erected in 1912 to the memory of George and Mary Lewis, of Teuthill: the brass lectern was presented in 1889, by the tenants of the Alvanley estate, to the memory of the Countess of Haddington, who died May 29th, 1889.

The church affords 220 sittings. The register dates from the year 1790. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £232, with residence, in the gift of the Earl of Haddington, and held since 1913 by the Rev. Francis Roebuck Gillespy B.A. of Hatfield Hall, Durham. The vicarage house, erected by the last Lord Alvanley, stands on a rising ground near the village. Alvanley Castle, which stood near the church, has long disappeared, but traces of the moat remain. There is a reading room in the village supported by members' subscriptions. The Earl of Haddington K.T. owns nearly the whole of the land. The soil is sandy; subsoil, red sandstone; the chief crops are potatoes, wheat, oats and winter food for cattle. The area is 1,513 acres; rateable value, £2,554; population in 1911 was 306.

ANTROBUS is a township, and with Sevenoaks is a parish, formed in 1848 from the civil parish of Great Budworth. The township of Antrobus is $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles north-west from Northwich station, on the Cheshire Lines and London and North Western railways, and 6 south-east from Warrington, in the Northwich division of the county, hundred of Bucklow, Runcorn union, Northwich county court district, petty sessional division of Leftwich, rural deanery of Frodsham and archdeaconry and diocese of Chester. The church of St. Mark, erected in 1848, is a building of red sandstone, in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, south aisle, south porch, and a small central turret, with spire, containing one bell: the chancel was beautifully decorated in 1863, and three stained windows added, at the sole expense of Samuel Higginbottom esq. of Glasgow, in memory of his wife: two other stained windows were erected in 1878, by the tenants and friends of the late Rev. George

Eaton M.A. of The Pole: there are 220 sittings. The register dates from the year 1848. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £220, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Great Budworth, and held since 1895 by the Rev. Joseph Holden, of St. Aidan's. There is a Wesleyan chapel. Selby's charity of £2 10s. 8d. is for distribution. The Pole, the property of Gerard Lawder Eaton esq. of 26 Cambridge terrace, Hyde Park, London W, is a fine mansion in extensive pleasure grounds, and is the residence of Charles Leonard Agnew esq. The Crown claims the manorial rights. Col. Sir Edmund Antrobus bart. of Amesbury Abbey, Wilts, is chief landowner. The soil is clayey; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are wheat, oats and potatoes. The area of the parish is 2,745 acres, and of the township, 2,114 acres; rateable value of the township, £3,797; the population in 1911 was—ecclesiastical parish, 536; township, 387.

GREAT BOUGHTON is a village and township in the parish of St. Oswald, Chester, partly within the limits of the municipal and parliamentary borough of Chester and bounded on the north by the river Dee; it is $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-east from the Cross, in the Eddisbury division of the county, lower division of the hundred of Broxton, union and county court district of Chester and petty sessional division of Chester Castle. During the Civil war this village was the scene of several encounters between the Royalists and Parliamentary forces; in 1644, Chester being then besieged by the latter, a detachment of the garrison sallied forth to attack a Parliamentary force posted in the adjoining village of Christleton; the skirmish began at Great Boughton, and after a severe struggle the Parliamentarians retired, but about 140 of the king's party were slain, most of them being citizens of Chester. The whole of Great Boughton, including the hall, was burned down by the garrison of Chester in order to prevent the enemy from re-occupying it. Most of the land is cultivated as market gardens, which furnish abundant supplies to the Chester market. Boughton Hall, the property of Capt. W. G. T. Currie, and the residence of Joseph Cooper esq. is an ancient mansion of the 17th century, with a good entrance porch; the hall has a floor of polished oak and a fireplace surrounded by Dutch tiles,

and bearing the date 1655; it has been in the possession of the Currie family since the time of Henry VII.; Vicar's Cross is the residence of Mrs. Lowry. Capt. W. G. T. Currie, of the Old Hall, Christleton, is lord of the manor and principal landowner. The soil is loam; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are vegetables, strawberries &c. The area is 723 acres; rateable value, £9,795; the population in 1911 was 1,336, of which 440 are in Chester parliamentary borough, including 25 inmates and 5 officials in Tarvin workhouse.

BOWDON

BOWDON is an extensive parish and township, 9 miles south from Manchester, 7 from Knutsford, 12 from Northwich and 1 south-west from Altrincham, with a station locally in Stamford road, Altrincham, on the Manchester, South Junction and Altrincham railway, and connected also with the neighbouring stations on the London and North Western and Cheshire Lines railways (Hale Station), in the Altrincham division of the county, hundred and union of Bucklow, county court district of Altrincham, rural deanery of Bowdon, archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of Chester. The town occupies a commanding eminence, affording fine views of the valley of Bollin and the surrounding country for many miles; its delightful and healthy situation, and the facilities of railway communication which it enjoys, have made it a popular place of residence for the wealthier classes of Manchester.

"The Local Government Act, 1858" was adopted 22 Jan. 1864, but the township, formerly under the control

of a Local Board, is now governed by an Urban District Council, under the provisions of the "Local Government Act, 1894" (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73) and is supplied with water by the North Cheshire Water Co.

The Urban District is divided into East, North, South and West Wards.

The parish church of the Blessed Virgin Mary, first erected during the Saxon times, and thrice restored, according to a brass inscription in the interior, in the years 1100, 1320 and 1570, was rebuilt with enlargements, on the same site, in 1860, at a cost of £15,000, under the direction of Mr. W. H. Brakspear, architect, of Manchester, in the Transition style between the Decorated and Perpendicular periods, and is a cruciform edifice, consisting of chancel, with north and south chapels, transepts, clerestoried nave, north and south porches, and an embattled western tower, 91 feet in height, with pinnacles, and containing a clock and 6 bells: the base of the tower forms a western porch:

both chapels were formerly the burying places of the Earls of Stamford and Warrington, but the present family vault is under the south or Dunham chapel: in the south or Dunham chapel is a fine mural monument with inscribed tablet, sculptures and allegorical figures to Henry 2nd Baron Delamere and 1st Earl of Warrington, tried for high treason, but honourably acquitted, 1676; ob. 2 Jan. 1693-4; and to Mary (Langham) his countess, ob. 23 March, 1690-91; here also is another large mural monument, with Ionic pillars supporting a pediment adorned with figures of cherubs, and at the back a shield of arms of 60 quarterings and two medallion portraits; on the monument is a long inscription to the Hon. Langham Booth, d. 12 May, 1724; and to the Hon. Henry Booth, M.P. for Cheshire, 1661-80, d. 2 Feb. 1726-7: in Carrington chapel is a fine monument with recumbent effigies, to William Brereton esq. of Ashley, ob. 29 Aug. 1630, and Jane (Warburton) his wife, ob. 2 March, 1627; the figure of the former lies under an arch in the upper stage of the monument, and below, under a marble canopy, supported on pillars of the Corinthian order, is that of his wife; ten members of the Brereton family were buried here from 1570 to 1660, and the registers also record numerous baptisms: in the chancel proper is a brass to the Rev. John Kingsley M.A. formerly curate here, and some time vicar of Dunham Massey, d. Nov. 1869; and one to Ven. William Pollock D.D. vicar of Bowdon and archdeacon of Chester, d. 11 Oct. 1873; and there are other memorials to Thomas Assheton Smith esq. d. 1769, and Harriet his wife, d. 1778, and to Thomas, their son, d. 1774; and to Edward Jeremiah Lloyd esq. of Oldfield Hall, d. 3 July, 1850: the stained east window was presented by W. Nield esq. in memory of his wife, who died in 1859, and the west window, a memorial to Margaret Annie Clegg, was placed in 1854 by her parents; the large stained windows in the transepts were given by Lady Murray, of Oldfield Hall, and E. Joynson esq. of Bowdon, and there are five others, chiefly memorials: the font, presented in 1860 by Miss Joynson, consists of an octagonal basin of Painswick stone, richly carved, and supported on a shaft of Devonshire marble: the brass lectern was the gift of the parishioners in 1911: there are 1,164 sittings in addition to those in the Dunham chapel: the churchyard was levelled and inclosed by a wall and railings in 1860. The register dates from the year 1627. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £620, with 10 acres of glebe and residence, erected in 1864, in the gift of the Bishop of Chester, and held since 1911 by the Ven. Alfred Maitland Wood M.A. of Trinity College, Cambridge, archdeacon of Macclesfield, examining chaplain to the Bishop of Chester, and surrogate. The mission church of St. Luke, in Vicarage lane, erected in 1882, is served from the parish church. The St. Paul's Wesleyan Methodist chapel, Envile road, erected in 1880, at a cost, including Sunday schools and minister's house, of £30,000, is a building of stone, in the Gothic style, from designs by Mr. W. H. Brakspear, architect, and will seat 700 persons. There is one other small Wesleyan Methodist chapel in Priory street. The charities for distribution in bread, to be given away to the poor every Sunday, and in clothing, amount altogether to about £110 yearly; George Earl of Warrington left by will dated 22 July, 1754, a sum of £5,000, in 1902 of the capital value of £5,610, invested in Consols, for apprenticing, educating or clothing poor children, or for clothing or affording other relief to aged persons; Walton's, Cooke's, and Bagshaw's charities produce £216 yearly for educational purposes and bedding. The Earl of Stamford is lord of the manor and chief landowner. The population of the township and Urban District in 1911 was 3,044; the acreage, 845 acres of land and 5 of water; rateable value in 1914, £30,594.

The population of the wards in 1911 was:—East, 849; North, 735; South, 854 & West, 606.

The population of the ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 4,101.

BREDBURY is an extensive parish, 2½ miles north-east from Stockport, with a station on the Great Central (late M., S. and L.) and Midland Joint railway, and 1½ miles south-west from Romiley station on the same line, in the Hyde division of the county of Cheshire, hundred of Macclesfield, Stockport union and county court district, petty sessional division of Stockport, rural deanery of Stockport, archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of Chester.

The "Local Government Act, 1858," was adopted here 6th January, 1865, and the district has since been extended under the Act 43 and 44 Vict. c. 58 (1880) so as to include Romiley. The former Local Board has been superseded by an Urban District Council, under the provisions of the "Local Government Act, 1894" (56 and 57 Vict. c. 73). By the Stockport Borough (Extension) Order of 1901, which came into operation 19th November, 1901, 193 acres of Bredbury parish were added to the Borough of Stockport, and by the Bredbury and Romiley Extension Order of 1902, part of the parish of Brinnington, 461 acres, was added to the parish of Bredbury. The ecclesiastical parish was formed Sept. 8, 1846, from the parish of Stockport. The church of St. Mark, erected in 1848 at a cost of £3,330, is a building of stone in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave of five bays, aisles, west porch and a western tower with pinnacles containing a clock with four dials and one bell: in the chancel is a memorial window to Zipporah, wife of the late W. C. Vaudrey esq. d. 10th May, 1873, and to Harriet, his sister, d. 27th December, 1868; to the Misses Rowbotham, erected in 1908, and to Mrs. Mary Marriott: the brass lectern was presented in memory of Thomas Wild esq.; a carved oak pulpit and prayer desk were provided in 1892 by public subscription, as a memorial to the Rev. James Whittaker B.A. vicar here 1846-91, and an oak reredos was presented by Mr. T. Clegg, of Holly Mount, Bredbury, in 1906: the church affords 740 sittings, of which 338 are free; the lych gate was erected in 1901 in memory of Mr. Clegg Livesey, by his widow and daughters, at a cost of about £300. The register dates from the year 1846. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £298, with residence, in the gift of the Bishop of Chester, and held since 1900 by the Rev. Stephen Percival Gray L.Th. and Assoc. of K.C.Lond. and surrogate. Charities:—The sum of £25 18s. yearly, derived from the Barrack Hill school property, is applied to educational purposes here in the form of yearly prizes in money to children who have been for three years in regular attendance at any elementary school in Bredbury or Romiley. Bredbury Hall, the property of the trustees of Ralph Horsfield esq. is now the residence of Louis Hyde esq. The area of the parish of Bredbury is 2,735 acres of land and 66 of water; rateable

value, £38,614; that of the Urban District of Bredbury and Romiley, 3,726; rateable value, £57,454. The population of Bredbury in 1911 was 5,785, that of the Urban District, 8,683, viz.:—Bredbury, 5,785; Romiley, 2,898.

The population of Bredbury ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 5,703.

HATHERLOW and **WOODLEY** are hamlets in this parish. There is a new Congregational chapel and Sunday school at George lane, built in 1912; another at Hatherlow, erected in 1846, first founded in 1645, and a primitive Methodist chapel at Woodley, erected in 1868. There is a convent and school of the Nativity at Harrytown hall, an edifice dating from the middle of the 17th century, and adapted for this purpose in 1912. In the parish are collieries, brickfields and various factories. At Woodley are machinery works and several foundries and steel works. At Woodley is a junction station on the Great Central railway, and at Bredbury a station on the Great Central and Midland Joint railway.

DUNHAM MASSEY is a parish with a station on the Altrincham and Warrington section of the London and North Western railway, and is 2½ miles west from Altrincham, in the Altrincham division of the county, Bucklow hundred and union, Altrincham petty sessional division and county court district, rural deanery of

Bowdon, archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of Chester. The ecclesiastical parish was formed in 1855 out of the parish of Bowdon, and comprises the hamlets of Dunham, Oldfield, Woodhouses and Sinderland. The Bridgewater canal, now the property of the Manchester Ship Canal Co. passes through the town-

ship. The church of St. Margaret, erected in 1853-5, at the sole cost of the 7th Earl of Stamford and Warrington, estimated at £20,000, and consecrated 13 June, 1855, is a fine building of stone in the Perpendicular style, from designs by Mr. William Hayley, architect, of Manchester, and consists of chancel, clerestoried nave, south or Stamford chapel, aisles, transepts, south porch and a noble embattled tower with pinnacles, a ribbed spire and enriched flying buttresses, rising to an altitude of 210 feet and surmounted by a gilt cross; the tower contains a clock and 10 bells, the tenor weighing 1 ton 7 cwt. 3 qrs. and a set of 14 bells for chimes, all cast by Messrs. Taylor & Son, of Loughborough: the Stamford chapel, entered by a private door, has a richly-worked roof with pendant and is inclosed on two sides by oak screens of beautiful design: the Decorated east window, 30 by 14 feet, with rich tracery, is filled with stained glass representing prophets and saints, and all the windows in the transepts and north and east aisles contain stained glass representing different scriptural subjects: the reredos and font are all of Caen stone, exquisitely carved; the reredos has seven divisions, each filled with an enriched canopy, the centre three projecting from and rising above the others; richly-traceried buttresses with crockets and finials support these, and the whole is surmounted by an enriched cornice and Tudor-flower battlement: the pulpit is of carved oak with a stone base: an alabaster reredos was erected in 1906: the organ was enlarged in 1876: the nave has an open-framed oak roof, with curved ribs and hammer beams, at the ends of which are richly-executed figures of angels with expanded wings: the chancel roof is divided into panels with a large boss in the centre: the church is seated with open oak benches, and affords 630 sittings. The register dates from the year 1855. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £414, in the gift of the trustees of the late Earl of Stamford, and held since 1908 by the Rev. Hewlett Johnson M.A. of Wadham College, Oxford. All Saints', built in 1898 as a chapel of ease to St. Margaret's, is in Regent road, Altrincham.

DUNHAM TOWN is an ecclesiastical parish formed in 1898: the church of St. Mark, erected in 1864, at a cost of £1,200, on a site granted by the 7th Earl of Stamford and Warrington, is a small building of stone in the Gothic style, consisting of chancel, nave, south porch and central turret containing one bell: there are 241 sittings, of which 111 are free. The register dates from the year 1864. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £298, with residence, in the gift of the vicar of Bowdon, and held since 1914 by the Rev. Ernest Robert Tarbuck B.A. of London University. Bowdon Downs Congregational chapel, erected in 1848, was enlarged in 1864, and will seat 800 persons. Trinity Presbyterian Church of England, Delamere road, erected in 1872, is a building of stone lined with white bricks; it has a large tower and spire, and will seat 400 persons; adjoining is a Sunday school. There is a mission hall in Police street, Altrincham, in connection with this chapel. Altrincham Urban District Infectious Diseases Hospital was erected in 1908, at a cost of £13,465, and will hold 32 patients. The Bowdon branch of the Manchester Hospital for Consumption and Diseases of the Throat, in Woodville road, comprises 4 large wards, 2 sitting rooms, dining rooms and apartments for the staff; it contains 50 beds; the average yearly number of patients is 240; the board of management consists of 17 members. Leicester's charity of £5 17s. yearly, founded by will in 1858, is for clothing. Dunham Massey Hall, a handsome structure of brick surrounding a quadrangular court, is the property and residence of the Countess of Stamford; the mansion, which contains some good family and other paintings by old masters, was rebuilt in 1721, and stands in a park of 252 acres, abounding with fine timber and adorned with several sheets of water; a herd of about 100 deer is kept here, and there is another park of 130 acres adjoining. The township contains some good residences, principally occupied by Manchester merchants. The trustees of the Earl of Stamford, who is a minor, are lords of the manor and the chief landowners. The area is 3,681 acres of land and 31 of water; rateable value, £34,857; the population in 1891 was 2,047, and in 1911 was 2,928 in the civil and 3,383 in the ecclesiastical parish.

The population of St. Mark, Dunham Town, ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 695.

OLDFIELD is a hamlet in Dunham Massey parish, about a mile west from Altrincham. The land is principally employed for market gardening and farming purposes, although a number of residences have lately been erected.

Seamon's Moss Endowed School, originally founded for 50 boys from Altrincham, Dunham Massey & Bowdon, was formerly carried on in a large school building erected in 1759, but in 1867 new premises were built on a site adjacent & enlarged in 1899, for 200 boys & further enlarged in 1909, for 270 boys & there is an average attendance of 190: in 1910 a scheme was set forth by the Charity Commissioners for the administration of the foundation, under which a yearly sum of £60 is applied to the maintenance of scholarships & exhibitions, each of the value of £10 yearly, to boys who have attended a public elementary school, one year to have been spent at the school of the foundation; such exhibitions to be held at a secondary school of the county; A. Sheppard, head master; H. Litherland, second master; J. Adams B.Sc. third master; S. H. Orme, F. Whitehead & F. Waywell, assistants; G. Wood, manual instructor

SINDERLAND is a hamlet on the north side of the township of Dunham Massey, consisting of several scattered farmhouses. At Sinderland Green is a Wesleyan Methodist chapel, erected 1881. There is also a Congregational Mission room at Lowerhouses. The soil is light and sandy and admirably adapted for market gardening, which is carried on here to a great extent, spade husbandry being principally resorted to for the cultivation of the land, in which females take an active part.

DUNHAM-ON-THE-HILL is a village, township
and parish, containing the township of Hapsford, and was
formed into a parish in 1888 from that of Thornton-in-the-
Moors; it is on the high road between Chester and War-
rington, with a station on the London and North Western
and Great Western joint railway, 33 miles from Man-
chester, 6 north-east from Chester and 14 south-west
from Warrington, in the Eddisbury division of the county,
Chester Castle petty sessional division, Chester union and

county court district, and in the rural deanery, archdea-
conry and diocese of Chester. The church of St. Luke,

GUILDEN SUTTON (or Sutton Guilden) is a township, parish and small village, three-quarters of a mile from Mickle Trafford stations on the London and North Western and Cheshire Lines Committee railways, 3 miles east-north-east from Chester, 7 south-south-west from Frodsham and 7 west-north-west from Tarporley, in the Eddisbury division of the county, Tarvin union, lower division of the hundred of Broxton, petty sessional division of Chester Castle, Chester county court district, and rural deanery, archdeaconry and diocese of Chester. The church of St. John the Baptist is a small edifice of brick, consisting of chancel, nave, south porch and a western turret containing 2 bells, dated respectively 1666 and 1777: the font bears date 1635: a memorial tablet of serpentine marble in mosaic was erected in March, 1896, to the memory of the Rev. Edwin A. Pitcairn Campbell M.A. of Vicar's Cross, Chester, expenses being defrayed by local subscription: the church was restored in 1890 at a cost of £400, and affords 130 sittings. The register dates from the year 1595. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £200, with residence, in the gift of G. Egerton Warburton esq. and held since 1912 by the

Rev. Bernard Norman Atkinson M.A. of Victoria University, Manchester, and B.D. of Durham University, who is also chaplain of Tarvin union. Here is a Primitive Methodist chapel, erected in 1873. G. Egerton Warburton esq. who is lord of the manor, the trustees of the late Thomas Arthur Hope esq. R. G. H. Perryn esq. of Trafford Hall, and Robert C. Smith esq. are the principal landowners. The soil is clayey; subsoil, clay. The chief crops are wheat and oats. The area is 974 acres; rateable value, £2,422; the population in 1911 was 397.

HALE is an Urban District, much scattered, formerly in Bowdon parish, but by Order of the County Council was formed into a separate parish March 31, 1900, and by Order in Council dated July 28th, 1906, was created an ecclesiastical parish; it is in Altrincham division of the county, Bucklow hundred and union, Altrincham petty sessional division and county court district, and in the rural deanery of Bowdon, archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of Chester, about a mile south and east from Altrincham, consisting principally of private residences occupied by business men from Manchester. The Cheshire Lines railway from Altrincham to Chester, which runs in connection with the Great Northern, the Midland and Great Central railways, passes through the parish, and has a station here.

Hale is governed by an Urban District Council of twelve members, formed in 1900. St. Peter's, in Ashley road, formerly a chapel of ease to Bowdon parish church, was opened in 1892 and erected at a cost of upwards of £7,000: there are 400 sittings. The register dates from the year 1897. The living is a perpetual curacy, net yearly value £250 and residence, in the gift of the vicar of Bowdon, and held since 1906 by the Rev. John Ritson Brunskill M.A. of Queen's College, Oxford, who was curate in charge from 1893. **HALE BARNES** is a hamlet in Hale parish. The chapel of ease at Hale Barnes, erected in 1882 at a cost of £800, in connection with All Saints', Ringway, is an edifice in the black and white timbered style, and will seat 150 persons. The Congregational chapel in Ashley road, built in 1899 at a cost of £4,500, is a structure of red brick, and will seat 400 persons. At Hale Barnes is a Unitarian chapel, erected in 1723, with 160 sittings, and in connection with it a Sunday school, founded in 1787 and held in a building erected in 1880. The Wesleyan Methodist chapel, in Oak road, erected in 1880, is of brick, and will seat 300 persons. The Hale Free Library, opened in June, 1907, has about 3,000 volumes. The principal landowners are Lord Egerton of Tatton, the trustees of the late Sir William Cunliffe Brooks bart. (d. 1900), the trustees of J. Harrop esq. and Joseph Harrop Clibran and John Richardson esqrs. The trustees of the late Countess of Stamford and Warrington (d. 1905) are lords of the manor. The soil generally is sand and gravel, with here and there a stiff clay. The population in 1901 was 4,562, and in 1911, 8,351; the area is 1,284 acres of land and 4 of water; the rateable value is £74,559.

The population of the wards in 1911 was:—Central, 2,484; North, 2,787; South-East, 1,111; West, 1,969.

The population of ecclesiastical parish in 1911 was 3,332.

Ringway, formerly a hamlet in Hale township, has been formed into a separate civil parish, and will be found under a separate heading.

HALTON (or Haulton) is a township and village and was formed into a parish, including Norton, Stockham, Rock Savage and Astmoor, July 3, 1860, from the civil parish of Runcorn; it is in the Knutsford division of the county, Bucklow hundred, petty sessional division, union and county court district of Runcorn, and in the rural deanery of Frodsham, and archdeaconry and diocese of Chester. Halton village, standing on the top of an eminence commanding a fine view of the rivers Mersey and Weaver, is a mile and a half south-east of Runcorn, and has a station about 1½ miles south from the village on the London and North Western and Great Western joint railways: the village is lighted with

gas and supplied with water from works at Runcorn. The church of St. Mary the Virgin, standing on an eminence, is a building of red sandstone in the Gothic style, designed by the late Sir Gilbert Scott B.A. and consisting of chancel, clerestoried nave of four bays, aisles, south porch and a turret on the eastern gable of the nave containing one bell: there are 415 sittings, of which 164 are free. The registers date from the year 1732. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £230, with 80 acres of glebe and residence, in the gift of Sir R. Marcus Brooke bart. and held since 1907 by the Rev. Ernest Godwin Greenham, and surrogate. The Wesleyan chapel, erected in 1875, at a cost of

TIMPERLEY is a scattered village and township, formed into a parish in 1852 from the parish of Bowdon; it is on the old road from Altrincham to Stockport, 7½ miles south from Manchester, 8½ north-north-east from Knutsford, 13 from Northwich, 1½ north from Altrincham, 1 mile south from Timperley station on the Manchester. South Junction and Altrincham railway, and half a mile from Baguley station on the Stockport and Warrington section of the Cheshire Lines railway; there is also a station in the parish on the latter line called West Timperley. The parish is in the Altrincham division of the county, east division of Bucklow hundred and union, Altrincham county court district, rural deanery of Bowdon, archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of Chester. The Bridgewater canal runs through a part of the township. Christ Church, erected on a site given by John Barratt esq. consecrated and opened 27 Sept. 1849, and enlarged in 1864, is an edifice of Runcorn freestone in mixed styles, consisting of chancel, nave, aisles, transept, south porch and a western tower with spire containing one bell: a vestry was built in 1900 and an organ provided at a cost of £800, defrayed by the parishioners: the church affords 750 sittings. The register dates from the year 1849. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £345, with residence, in the gift of trustees, and held since 1905 by the Rev. George Daniel Wray M.A. of Jesus College, Cambridge. Here is a Wesleyan Methodist chapel, built in 1846. St. Andrew's school, in Deansgate lane, is used as a mission church, and is licensed for baptisms and Holy Communion; it will seat about 200. A recreation ground, consisting of 3½ acres, and provided with gymnasium and swings &c. was opened, at a cost of £600, in 1898. Pickering Lodge is the residence of Mrs. Clarke. Timperley Hall is now occupied by the Timperley Golf Club. Riddings Hall, now a farmhouse, is an ancient building, approached through a stone archway and surrounded by a moat, but a great portion of the house has been modernized. Fir Tree Farmhouse is another ancient dwelling of timber and plaster with projecting gables, and has over the doorway the date 1676. The trustees of the Earl of Stamford, who is a minor, are lords of

the manor. The representatives of the late Samuel Brooks esq. the trustees of J. Taylor esq. John Newton esq. of Altrincham, and George Hardy, A. Attenbury, Sydney L. Keymer, George and Duncan Stelfox, and Robert Preston Gill esqrs. and Miss Clarke are the chief landowners. The soil is clayey, and the subsoil marl. Market gardening is carried on to a great extent, and very large quantities of strawberries are grown here. The area of the parish is 1,631 acres of land and 7 of water; rateable value, £28,806; the population in 1911 was 4,090 in the civil and 5,645 in the ecclesiastical parish.

TINTWISTLE is a parish on a long narrow peninsula. in the extreme north-easterly portion of the county, bounded by Yorkshire on the north and Derbyshire on the south, on a bold acclivity commanding a fine view of a great part of Longdendale and of the Derbyshire Peak. on the road from Stockport to Penistone, Yorks, 13 miles east from Manchester, 5 north-east from Hyde and a mile north-west from Hadfield station on the Great Central railway, Hyde division of the county, Macclesfield hundred, Glossop county court district, Dukinfield petty sessional division, Ashton-under-Lyne union, rural deanery of Mottram, archdeaconry of Macclesfield and diocese of Chester. The houses are built of stone, obtained from the neighbouring quarries, and below the village runs the Etherow stream. Christ Church is an ecclesiastical parish formed in 1838.

The church, erected 1837, at a cost of £2,000, is a plain edifice of local stone in the Early English style, consisting of chancel, nave, north and south porches and a western tower containing a clock and one bell: there are 800 sittings. The register dates from the year 1838. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £280, with residence, in the gift of trustees, and held since 1898 by the Rev. John William Fairhurst M.A. of Oriel College, Oxford, and B.D. of London University. There is a Congregational chapel seating 800 persons, and a Wesleyan chapel, erected in 1830, with 250 sittings. Tintwistle Hall, formerly a timber-framed mansion, but rebuilt of stone in 1653, was anciently the seat of the De Burgh family, then lords of this manor. The principal landowner is Lord Tollemache, who is also lord of the manor. The area is 11,559 acres of
