The Alphabetical or Referential portion of the Volume, which immediately precedes the Classification of Trades, requires perhaps a little explanation—It includes the whole of the Names and Firms that appear in the Classified arrangement, but instead of the residences being added, figures are substituted, referring to the respective column or columns of the trades lists, where the full address of the Party required will be found.

In the department of Conveyance, the best information connected with Railway communication is afforded ; while the less modern modes of transit have been noticed with every regard to correctness.

The country portion of the Volume has been extended by the introduction of some large towns of commercial importance not given in the last edition,—amongst these appear PRESTON, CONGLETON, GLOSSOP, NEW MILLS, &c.

Having made these customary remarks, Messrs. Pigot & Slater place their volume in the hands of the subscribers, convinced that its improvement will show that undiminished support, so far from having produced any relaxation in their industry and vigilance, it has been a stimulus to additional energy.
