POPULATION, &c.—By the Returns made to Government, at the census of 1841, Cheshire contained 193,646 males, and 202,014 females—total, 395,660; exhibiting an increase over the returns of 1831 of 61,346 inhabitants. The annual value of Real Property in this county, as assessed to the Poor Rates, in 1815, amounted to £1,083,983. and in 1841, to £1,423,835.

ALTRINCHAM,

WITH THE VILLAGES AND TOWNSHIPS OF BOWDON, DUNHAM-MASSEY, TIMPERLEY, CARRINGTON, PARTINGTON, ASHTON-UPON-MERSEY, CROSS STREET, WARBURTON, LYMM, AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

ALTRINCHAM is a respectable and clean market town and chapelry, in the parish of Bowdon, and hundred of Bucklow, 30 miles N. E. from Chester, 7 N. from Knutsford, and 8 S. S. W. from Manchester. At the entrance of the town, which is of considerable length, passes the Duke of Bridgewater's canal, convenient to which is the 'Navigation Inn,' where passengers are accommodated while waiting for the packets, which pass between Manchester, Runcorn, Liverpool, &c. There are some other good inns in the town, among which may be mentioned, the 'Unicorn,' and the 'Stamford Arms'—the latter as having an excellent bowling green. The situation of the town is dry and remarkably healthy, and the views upon the high grounds about Bowdon are extensive and pleasing. Dunham Park is the finest seat in the neighbourhood, but there are many handsome residences that border the town, the gardens of which display great taste. The spinning of linen thread and bobbin turning are the only branches that can well be named under the head of manufactures. Agriculture is the prevailing occupation of the labouring class—while the produce of the many gardens around assist in supplying the Manchester markets.

Hamon de Massey, in the time of Edward I, granted many privileges to the inhabitants of the town—amongst others, a *guild mercatory*, or 'Society of Free Traffic,' together with freedom from tolls throughout the barony, &c. A court leet is held by the Earl of Stamford and Warrington, who is lord of the manor: the chief officer is styled 'mayor,' but he does not exercise any magisterial functions. Altrincham is included in the seventh circuit of county court towns, under the new act (passed August, 1846,) for the recovery of debts under £20.

The church, or rather chapel, under Bowdon is of brick, erected by subscription in 1799: neither its exterior or interior exhibits anything remarkable—it corresponds in neatness with the town, which is marked by an air of quiet comfort and respectability. The living of Altrincham is in the gift of the Vicar of Bowdon; the Rev. Francis Orton is the present incumbent. The other places of worship, with their locality and ministers are named in a subsequent page. There are schools for the instruction of the humbler class of children, and several superior private seminaries. The market is held on Tuesday, and the fairs April 29th,

August 5th, and November 22nd, for cattle, toys, &c. The population of Altrincham chapelry, in 1831, was 2,708, and in 1841, 3,399.

Bowdon is a populous and extensive parish—the village is delightfully situated, for the most part, on an elevated site, about a mile from Altrincham. A short distance to the west of the village is the extensive and beautiful park of Dunham, which we shall again notice under the township of that name. The parish church of Saint Nicholas is said to have existed prior to the Conquest; it consists of a nave, chancel and side aisles, the ceilings of which are of oak, neatly carved. The church stands on a considerable elevation, and from its cemetery and tower—the summit of the latter especially, the views are extensive and highly picturesque—the land being in a fine state of cultivation and richly embellished with wood. Several handsome monuments adorn the church—those to members of the Warrington family may be particularly noticed. The living of Bowdon is a vicarage, of which the Rev. W. H. G. Mann, A. M., is the incumbent. A grammar school was founded here in 1600, and the school-house was rebuilt in 1806. There are some endowed schools and others for gratuitous instruction in different parts of the parish, which are noticed in their place in the directory. The soil throughout the parish is principally of a light and sandy nature, peculiarly favourable to the growth of the potato, large quantities of which are produced here. The entire parish contained, in 1831, 8,200 inhabitants, and in 1841, 9,373, of which last number about 600 were returned for the township.

DUNHAM-MASSEY is a township and village—the latter separated from that of Bowdon by Dunham Park, before mentioned—and which, with the mansion, are objects of great attraction in this neighbourhood. The latter is a large brick building, of quadrangular form, and contains a collection of paintings familiar to all admirers of the fine arts; amongst the portraits are rare specimens from the pencils of Hans Holbein, Jansen, Vandyke, Sir Peter Lely, Sir Godfrey Kneller, &c. The family plate is said to rival, in splendour and value, most services in the kingdom. The parks, which abound with fine lofty timber, furnish pasture to numerous deer. The grounds are much frequented by parties from Manchester and its neighbourhood in the summer season. Population of the township, in 1841, was 1253.

TIMPERLEY is a township, likewise in Bowdon parish, 2 miles N.E. from Altrincham; and also forms part of the Dunham estates. Timperley Hall is a handsome building, and its situation remarkably pleasant. The population of the township is 943.

CARRINGTON is a chapelry, in the parish of Bowdon, about 3½ miles N.W. from Altrincham, possessed by the Earl of Stamford and Warrington, who also presents to the living, which is a perpetual curacy, enjoyed at present by the Rev. George Heron. The population of the chapelry is 559.

PARTINGTON is a township and small village, also in the parish of Bowdon, 4 miles N.W. from Altrincham. At **MILL BANK** is a considerable paper manufactory belonging to Messrs. Greaves & Co. There are in the township places of worship for Wesleyan and Primitive Methodists and Calvinists. Population of the township, 457.

ASHTON-UPON-MERSEY is a parish, township, and village—the latter scattered over a large extent of ground, is about 4½ miles N. from Altrincham, and 7 S. from Manchester. The Earl of Stamford and Warrington is proprietor of the manor, and holds a court for the same. The parish church of Saint Martin is rather a handsome building of stone; the living is a rectory, of which the Rev. Charles Backhouse Sowerby is the present incumbent. The parish contained, in 1841, 2,414 inhabitants, and the township about half that number. The hamlet of **CROSS STREET** forms a portion of Ashton, and its population is returned therewith.

WARBURTON is a parish and village—the latter about 4 miles W. from Altrincham. The estates are possessed by the Warburton's, of Arley Hall, who hold courts leet and baron for the manor, and present to the living

of the parish. The church of Saint Werburgh stands on the banks of the Mersey, is one of ecc the living is a perpetual curacy, of which the Rev. F. E. Warburton is the present incumbent. twenty-five years since, three stone coffins, lying north side of the church, were opened, and in one found a human skeleton of extraordinary size; the coffins bore marks of great age, and are conjectured to have inclosed the remains of some of the men of the former monastic establishment. The population of the township is 509.

LYMM is a parish and village, in the same hundred. Altrincham—the village being about 6 miles N. from that town, and nearly the same distance E. by Warrington. The parish church of Saint Mary the Virgin, is of great age; from the steeple, (which was rebuilt in 1521,) is commanded a remarkably fine prospect—varied picturesque and heightened in beauty by several fine falls of water from an extensive moor into a romantic dale, where they join the river Mersey. The living of Lymm is a rectory, of which the Rev. William M'yer is the incumbent. Lymm Hall, a remarkably situated, is an ancient mansion, partly moated; and the bay windows of the principal drawing room have some fine specimens of stained glass. The south gate is an ancient cross, the lower part of which are cut in the solid rock. Dauls Bank, formerly the residence of the Halsteads, now the seat of the late Sir John Trafford, Esq.; and Oughtrington Hall, the seat of the late Sir John Trafford, Esq., are handsome residences commanding fine prospects of the country round. A grammar school, which stands near the church, was endowed in 1698 by Sir George Warburton and William Domville, Esq. The parish contained, in 1841, 2,658 inhabitants.
