ALTRINCHAM,

WITH THE VILLAGES AND TOWNSHIPS OF BOWDON, DUNHAM-MASSEY,
 TIMPERLEY, HALE, ASHLEY, BOLLINGTON, CARRINGTON, PARTINGTON,
 ASHTON-UPON-MERSEY, CROSS STREET, WARBURTON,
 LYMM, AND NEIGHBOURHOODS.

ALTRINCHAM is a respectable and clean market town and chapelry, in the parish of Bowdon, hundred of Bucklow, 30 miles N. E. from Chester, 7 N. from Knutsford, and 8 s.s.w. from Manchester; situated on the line of the South Junction Railway, in a dry and remarkably healthy locality, whilst the views on the high grounds about Bowdon are extensive and pleasing. Dunham Park is the finest seat in the neighbourhood, but there are many handsome residences that border the town, the gardens of which display great taste. At the entrance of the town, which is of considerable length, passes the Duke of Bridgewater's Canal, convenient to which is the 'Navigation Inn,' where passengers are accommodated while waiting for the packets, which pass between Manchester, Runcorn, Liverpool, &c. There are some other good inns in the town, among which may be mentioned the 'Unicorn,' and the 'Stamford Arms'—each having an excellent bowling green. Agriculture is the prevailing occupation of the labouring class—while the produce of the many gardens around assist in supplying the Manchester markets. Hamon de Massey, in the time of Edward I. granted many privileges to the inhabitants of the town—amongst others, a *guild mercatory*, or Society of Free Traffic, together with freedom from tolls throughout the barony, &c. A court leet is held by the Earl of Stamford and Warrington, who is lord of the manor: the chief officer is styled 'mayor,' but he does not exercise any magisterial functions. Altrincham is included in the seventh circuit of towns, under the County Court Acts for the recovery of debts to any amount not exceeding £50.

The church, or rather chapel, under Bowdon is of brick, erected by subscription in 1799: neither its exterior or interior exhibits anything remarkable—it corresponds in neatness with the town, which is marked by an air of quiet comfort and respectability. The living of Altrincham is in the gift of the vicar of Bowdon. The other places of worship, with their locality and ministers are named in a subsequent page. There are

schools for instructing the humbler class of children, and several superior private seminaries. The market is held on Tuesday, and the fairs April 29th, August 5th, and November 22nd, for cattle, toys, &c. The population of the chapelry in 1841 was 3,399, and in 1851, 4,488.

Bowdon is a populous and extensive parish—the village is delightfully situated, for the most part, on an elevated site, about a mile from Altrincham. A short distance to the west of the village is the extensive and beautiful park of Dunham, which we shall again notice under the township of that name; and within these few years have been erected a great number of tasteful villas, occupied chiefly by the merchants and wealthy tradesmen of Manchester. A great impetus to building has been given by the railway, which has furnished so rapid and ready a means of transit between Manchester and this pleasant neighbourhood.

The parish church of Saint Nicholas is said to have existed prior to the Conquest; it consists of a nave, chancel and side aisles, the ceilings of which are of oak, neatly carved. The church stands on a considerable elevation, and from its tower, the views are extensive and highly picturesque—the land being in a fine state of cultivation and richly embellished with wood. Several handsome monuments adorn the church—those to members of the Warrington family may be particularly noticed. The living of Bowdon is a vicarage. A grammar school was founded here in 1600, and the school-house was rebuilt in 1806. There are some well endowed schools and others for gratuitous instruction in different parts of the parish, which are noticed in their place in the directory. The soil throughout the parish is principally of a light and sandy nature, peculiarly favourable to the growth of the potato, large quantities of which are produced here. The entire parish contained in 1841, 9,385 inhabitants, and in 1851, 11,228, of the latter number, 1,164 were returned for the township.

DUNHAM-MASSEY is a township and village—the latter separated from that of Bowdon by Dunham Park, before mentioned—and which, with the mansion, are objects of great attraction in this neighbourhood. The Hall is a large brick building, of quadrangular form, and contains a collection of paintings familiar to all admirers of the fine arts; amongst the portraits are specimens from the pencils of Hans Holbein, Jansen, Vanduyke, Sir Peter Lely, Sir Godfrey Kneller, &c. The family plate is said to rival, in splendour and value, most services in the kingdom. The parks, which abound with fine lofty timber, furnish pasturage to numerous deer. The grounds are much frequented by parties from Manchester and its neighbourhood in the summer and afford a delightful recreation to the 'pent up citizen.' The Earl of Stamford and Warrington has erected a new church here; it was consecrated June 13th, 1855, and is dedicated to Saint Margaret. The building is of stone, and the style of architecture is of the 15th century. The present incumbent is the Rev. John Kingsley. The population of the township, in 1851, was 1,255.

TEMPERLEY is a township likewise in Bowdon parish, 2 miles N. E. from Altrincham; and also forms part of the Dunham estates. Temperley Hall is a handsome building, and its situation remarkably pleasant. In September, 1849, was opened a new church for this district: it is a handsome building of stone dedicated as Christchurch. The Wesleyans have also a chapel here. The population of the township is about one thousand.

HALE is a township, also in Bowdon parish, about 2½ miles S. E. from Altrincham, containing about one thousand inhabitants.

ASHLEY is a township, also in Bowdon parish, between two and three miles S. by W. from Hale, situated on the verge of Tatton park. Ashley Hall, the ancient manorial mansion is worthy of notice as containing portraits of certain influential gentlemen of the county, who formed a club during the progress of the Pretender through the north, in 1715, favourable to his designs. Thomas Ashteton, Esq. the then owner of the manor, deciding, however, against the expediency of joining the standard of revolt, the enterprise was abandoned. A chapel for Wesleyan Methodists is in the township, the population of which is about 400.

BOLLINGTON is a township, partly in the parish of Bowdon but chiefly in that of Rostherne, about three miles S. from Bowdon. The population in 1851 was 300.

CARRINGTON is a chapelry in the parish of Bowdon, about five miles N. W. from Altrincham, possessed by the Earl of Stamford and Warrington, who also presents to the living—which is a perpetual curacy. The population of the chapelry is about 540.

PARTINGTON is a township and small village, also in the parish of Bowdon, somewhat over two miles W.S.W. from Carrington. At MILL BANK is a considerable paper manufactory, belonging to the Messrs. Ocklestones'. There are in the township places of worship for Wesleyan and Primitive Methodists and Calvinists. Population of the township, about 500.

ASHTON-UPON-MERSEY is a parish, township and village—the latter scattered over a large extent of ground, is about 3½ miles north from Altrincham, and 7 south from Manchester. The Earl of Stamford and Warrington is proprietor of the manor, and holds a court for the same. The parish church of Saint Martin is rather a handsome building of stone; the living is a rectory, of which the Rev. Charles Backhouse Sowerby is the present incumbent. The parish contained in 1841, 2,414 inhabitants, and in 1851, 2,894, of which latter number 1,174 were returned for the township.

WARBURTON is a parish and village—the latter about four miles W. from Altrincham. The estates are possessed by the Warburtons' of Arley Hall, who hold courts leet and baron for the manor, and present to the living of the parish. The church of Saint Werburgh, which stands on the banks of the Mersey, is one of early date; the living is a perpetual curacy, annexed to the rectory of Lymm. Some years since, three stone coffins, lying on the north side of the church, were opened, and in one was found a human skeleton of extraordinary size. The coffins bore marks of great age, and are conjectured to have enclosed the remains of some of the members of the former monastic establishment. Population of the township about 500.

LYMM is a parish and village, in the same hundred as Altrincham—the village being about six miles E. from that town, and nearly the same distance E. by S. from Warrington. The parish church of Saint Mary the Virgin has been rebuilt upon an enlarged plan, and the expence defrayed by subscriptions: the living is a rectory in the gift of the Warburton and Legh families. A neat chapel for Baptists has been erected by Thomas Ridgway, Esq. Lymm Hall, commandingly situated, is an ancient mansion, partially moated; and the bay windows of the principal entrance room have some fine specimens of stained glass. Opposite the gates is an ancient cross, the lower steps of which are cut in the solid rock. Oughtington Hall, the seat of Trafford, Esq., is a handsome residence, commanding fine prospects of the country round. A free grammar school, which stands near the church, was endowed in 1698 by Sir George Warburton and William Comville, Esq. The parish contained, in 1851, 3,150 inhabitants.

ASHTON-UNDER-LYNE

As a market town, a borough (both corporate and parliamentary), and a manor and parish, in the hundred of Salford and diocese of Manchester. It is 196 miles N. W. by N. from London (203½ by rail), 6½ E. from Manchester, 36 E. by N. from Liverpool, 38 W. by N. from Sheffield, and 9½ from Birmingham (rail distances); situated on an eminence on the north bank of the river Tame. The primary part of the name of the town is derived from the Saxon words *asyc*, an ash, and *lyn*, an enclosed place or town; the adjunct, *under-Lyne*, is of obscure etymology, and various hypotheses have been ventured in elucidation of its origin. The most probable seems to be that of Mr. Coulthart, of this town, who, in his report on the borough, published, in 1844, by Her Majesty's commissioners for

inquiring into the state of large towns, ascribes the term to the situation of the town being near to, or under, that remarkable line or chain of hills which separate Lancashire from Yorkshire, popularly denominated 'the back-bone of England.' A singular custom prevails here on Easter-Monday; the ceremony consist in preparing an effigy of a man in armour, i.e. the 'Black Lad,' which is fixed on horse-back, and after being led in procession round the town, is dismounted at the Old Market cross, where it is torn to pieces, and the fragments usually burned amid the execrations of the populace. This custom, which is carefully maintained, and attracts annually many thousands of spectators from distant places, originated in the reign of Henry VI, to commemorate the abhorrence in which
